On a regular patrol back to his base he was shot in the head by a sniper. He was only 20 years old.

November Highlights

Texas Historical November Events

November 1528 – Cabeza de Vaca ship-wrecked on what is believed today to be Galveston Island. After trading in the region for some six years, he later explored the Texas interior on his way to Mexico.

November 3, 1835 – The Consultation met to consider options for the more autonomous rule for Texas. A document known as the Organic Law outlined the organization and functions of a new Provisional Government.

November 8, 1835 – The Grass Fight near San Antonio was won by the Texans under Jim Bowie and Ed Burleson. Instead of silver, however, the Texans gained a worthless bounty of grass.

November 25, 1850 – In a plan to settle boundary disputes and pay her public debt, Texas relinquished about one-third of her territory in the **Compromise of 1850**, in exchange for \$10,000,000 from the United States.



National Historical October Events

November 3: 1913: The first **American** citizens receive information over the new national income tax. A married man living with his wife, who is in receipt of an income of \$5,000 pays \$10 a year and if his income is \$10,000 he pays \$60 per year.

November 6: 1860: Abraham Lincoln is elected as the 16th President of the United States.

1952: Benjamin Harrison is elected as the 23rd President of the United States.

November 15: 1805 Lewis and Clark reach the Pacific Ocean at the mouth of the Columbia River.

November 22: 1963: John F. Kennedy Assassinated

November 26: 1883: Sojourner Truth, a former slave and prominent abolitionist and women's rights activist, dies in Battle Creek, Michigan.

November 28: 1861: Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation that government office be closed for a local day of thanksgiving. On Oct. 3th 1863 he issued a proclamation that the last Thursday of November be set aside as a day to Thanksgiving and Praise.

1954: Lewis Strauss, chairman of the United States Atomic Energy Commission, claims that nuclear power will provide "electricity too cheap to meter" in the future.

World Historical November Events

November 3: 1918: The Ottoman Empire signs an armistice with the Allies, marking the end of World War I.

November 4: 1558: Mary I (Bloody Mary) dies and Elizabeth I becomes Queen of England.

November 12: 1927: Josef Stalin takes full control of the Soviet Union

The most prominent symbol associated with Veterans Day is the Remembrance Poppy. The poppy's origin dates back to World War I, when Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae's poem "In Flanders Fields" described the red poppies growing among the graves of fallen soldiers. The poppy became a symbol of remembrance and was adopted by the British Legion and later by other countries, including the United States.
