Texas Historical July Events

July 1, 1845: Texas votes to accept annexation by the United States.

1874: The Texas Rangers, a legendary law enforcement agency, are reorganized by the state government.

July 2, 1928: A major flood strikes San Antonio, causing significant damage and loss of life.

July 3, 1886: The last military engagement between the United States and the Comanche Indians occurs in Texas.

July 10, 1917: The Texas State Capitol is dedicated in Austin.

July 12, 1901: <u>The Spindletop oil field in</u> <u>Beaumont begins production, marking the start of the Texas oil boom.</u>

July 15. 1839: Austin is officially incorporated as the capital of the Republic of Texas.

July 19, 1877: <u>The first train robbery in Texas occurs near Allen, Texas</u>.

July 21, 1861: Texas troops fight in the First Battle of Bull Run during the Civil War.

July 22 1864: Texas Confederate forces win the Battle of the Nueces in the Civil War.

July 26, 1845: The Texas Annexation Act is signed by U.S. President James K. Polk.

July 28, 1835: Texas settlers meet at the Convention of 1835 to discuss independence from Mexico.

July 29, 1839: The Republic of Texas officially declares Austin as its capital.
